  - First intake: September 2015

  - Enhanced teaching and learning


#### **Overview** MSocSc (Psy) – objectives

- For NON-PSYCHOLOGY Bachelor's degree holders
  - To acquire a solid foundation in psychology
  - To gain research competence
  - To prepare for career development in psychology and related fields

#### **Overview** MSocSc (Psy) – key features

- Emphasis on research training
  - Two research methodology courses
  - Empirical research dissertation
- Problem-based learning (PBL)
  - Use psychological science to solve real-world problems

#### **Overview** PBL – NOT memorization, BUT understanding



# How can social psychology help us think about real-world problems?

- 8 core courses + an empirical research dissertation
  - 1. Introduction to research methods in psychology
  - 2. Research and quantitative methods in psychology
  - 3. Biological psychology
  - 4. Cognitive psychology
  - 5. Developmental psychology
  - 6. Personality psychology
  - 7. Social psychology
  - 8. Abnormal psychology

#### Program structure Core courses

- For EACH course:
  - o 6 credits
  - One semester (~ 12 weeks)
  - Classes offered in weekday afternoons (mostly from 3:30pm)
  - 2-4 hours per week
  - Mostly problem-based learning (PBL)

#### **Program structure** Dissertation

12 credits

• From Sept to end of June (~10 months)

- Two semesters in each academic year:
  - Semester 1: Sept Dec (~12 weeks)
  - Semester 2: Jan May (~12 weeks)

#### Study mode: full-time vs. part-time Full-time study

- Full-time mode
  - Complete within ONE year
  - Semester 1: 4 courses (i.e., 4 afternoons per week)
  - Semester 2: 4 courses (i.e., 4 afternoons per week)
  - Dissertation throughout the year
    - Submission deadline: June 30
  - Tuition fee: HK\$135,000

#### Study mode: full-time vs. part-time Part-time study

- Part-time mode
  - Complete within TWO year
  - Year 1: 5 courses (i.e., 2 to 3 in each semester)
  - Year 2: 3 courses
  - Dissertation throughout Year 2
    - Submission deadline: June 30
  - Tuition fee: HK\$70,000 per year

- To become eligible to apply for:
  - MSocSc in Clinical Psychology
  - MSocSc in Educational Psychology
  - MPhil in Psychology
  - 4-year PhD in Psychology
  - Graduate membership of Hong Kong Psychological Society

#### • Entry requirements

- A Bachelor's degree NOT majoring in psychology
- With NO prior completion of similar conversion program in psychology
- Preferably more than one year of work experience
- English language requirement as detailed here:

- January 4, 2019 (Friday, 12:00 noon): Closing date for online application
- Mid February, 2019: Notify shortlisted candidates for interview and qualifying exam
- March 9, 2019 (Saturday): Interview and qualifying exam
  - Format of qualifying exam: ~45 min, MCQs on basic concepts of psychology



- Late March, 2019: Informal notification to successful candidates
- September 2, 2019 (Monday): First day of teaching
